

Application: Reactivity:	WB 1:500-1:2000, IHC 1:50-1:200 *The optimal dilutions should be determined by the end user. Human,Mouse,Rat	
Storage:	Rabbit IgG in phosphate buffered saline , pH 7.4, 150mM NaCl, 0.02% sodium azide and 50% glycerol. Store at -20 $^\circ$ C. Stable for 12 months from date of receipt.	
Purification:	The antiserum was purified by peptide affinity chromatography using SulfoLink TM Coupling Resin (Thermo Fisher Scientific).	
Immunogen:	A synthesized peptide derived from human MAPK10, corresponding to a region within C-terminal amino acids.

Description:	The stress-activated protein kinase/Jun-amino-terminal kinase SAPK/JNK is potently and preferentially activated by a variety of environmental stresses including UV and gamma radiation, ceramides, inflammatory cytokines, and in some instances, growth factors and GPCR agonists (1-6). As with the other MAPKs, the core signaling unit is composed of a MAPKKK, typically MEKK1-MEKK4, or by one of the mixed lineage kinases (MLKs), which phosphorylate and activate MKK4/7. Upon activation, MKKs phosphorylate and activate the SAPK/JNK kinase . Stress signals are delivered to this cascade by small GTPases of the Rho family (Rac, Rho, cdc42) . Both Rac1 and cdc42 mediate the stimulation of MEKKs and MLKs .
